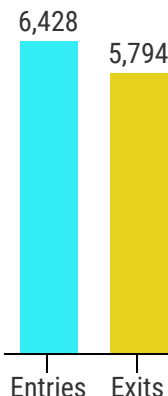


17% Returns to Homelessness within 24 months
